## **2022 Annual Fire Safety and Security Report contains valuable information about campus community**

The 2022 Annual Fire Safety and Security Report has been published by the University of Missouri — a report that contains valuable information about the campus community and is published each year in compliance with the provisions of the [Jeane Clery Disclosure and Campus Security Policy and Campus Crime statistics Act](#).

The report covers the previous academic year and contains information about safety measures and crime statistics at Mizzou. Information for the report is gathered from several area law enforcement agencies and university departments, including the University of Missouri Police Department, Columbia Police Department, Boone County Sheriff's Department, MU Office of Institutional Equity, Residential Life and the MU Office of Accountability and Support.

“We believe that maintaining a safe and secure campus is everyone’s responsibility at MU,” MUPD Chief Brian Weimer said. “We encourage you to review this important report.”

The report includes:

- Information about MUPD and the services the department provides
- How to report crimes and other emergencies on campus
- Programs to prevent sexual assault, domestic violence, dating violence and stalking
  - Primary prevention programs
  - Bystander intervention and risk reduction
  - Ongoing prevention and awareness campaigns
- Disciplinary proceedings
- University policies governing alcohol and other drugs
  - Drug and alcohol abuse education programs
- Security awareness programs
  - At-risk committee (behavioral intervention)
  - Crime prevention programs

*MUPD is the primary law enforcement agency for the University of Missouri. The agency currently is authorized to have 50 commissioned officers, eight security officers, 14 dispatchers, two administrative staff and five to 15 seasonally-dependent, part-time campus safety officers. MUPD is an internationally accredited law enforcement agency with the Commission on Law Enforcement Accreditation and the International Association of Campus Law Enforcement Administrators. On a typical day, nearly 45,000 faculty, staff, students and visitors are on the MU campus.*
